## Our Services

Silver Lining launched its poverty relief operation in Guangxi, China in 2005, committed to helping the impoverished ethnic minorities and orphans in the rural mountain areas by sponsoring their education and improving their living standards. Also, we provide rehabilitation training and education for children with cerebral palsy, offering employment opportunities to women and people with disabilities, and emergency medical assistance to children that came down with illness. We assist and care for children in distress, the migrant children, and those left behind children. The children will also receive our character education program. Beginning in 2017, we expanded our services to Myanmar to provide aids to orphans and children who have cerebral palsy. The Vietnam Silver Lining Rehabilitation Center formally started its service in 2019. Through our love and actions, we hope more people in need of assistance will receive care and blessings, which will improve their lives and restore their dignity and hope.

# A Home for Orphans

Myanmar - Pyin Oo Lwin

## PROJECT NAME Silver Lining Family Village " Give Orphans a Home"

Since 2017, with the support of local people in Myanmar, Silver Lining has established the Baganwun Silver Lining Family Village, which cares for orphans in a family-style setting. Each family is overseen by a caregiver who looks after around 10 children, allowing them to experience the warmth of a family again. By the end of 2023, the "Give Orphans a Home" sponsorship program has established 16 families, caring for a total of 189 children.

Silver Lining Family village is dedicated to serving impoverished orphans aged 6-18 with genuine love and practical actions, providing them with opportunities for higher education. Adopting a holistic care approach, we aim to surround them with love, warmth, and care in their environment. Our goal is to bring joy and hope to these children, enrich their social participation, and guide them towards a brighter future. Our services include nurturing orphan families, providing appropriate nutrition and regular check-ups, offering language and tutoring classes for children with poor learning foundations, as well as cultivating good values and relationships through team and youth activities.





China - Dahua, Guangxi

PROJECT NAME Nanning Silver Lining Caring Center

The Dahua Silver Lining Caring Center launched the "Give Orphans a Home" project in 2009, targeting local orphans, left-behind children, and children with disabilities, providing care services for them in a "family" model. The services of the Caring Center are based on four main objectives, including ensuring healthy growth for mountainous orphans and underprivileged children, providing them with educational opportunities, offering appropriate care, protection, participation, and teaching them to love others as themselves and their neighbors. Over the past year, the center has achieved these four goals through various activities, establishing 7 families and serving a total of 101 orphans.

In 2023, the Center continues to provide diversified services for children, including character education, interest development, educational support, and growth groups, helping children establish correct values, cultivate their interests, enhance their learning abilities, and empower them through teamwork and communication for healthy growth. Regular family days are also held to ensure that children can build self-esteem and confidence in a loving environment.



Myanmar - Lashio & Namsang

PROJECT NAME Foster Care Family

Thanks to the support of local couples in Lashio and Nan Station, Silver Lining has helped many orphans in both locations by providing them with various forms of care including food, shelter, clothing, education, and more. As of 2023, there are 10 beneficiaries in Nan Station and 7 beneficiaries in Lashio.

Due to continuing influence from the international situation and unstable prices in Myanmar, with Silver Lining's efforts, fostered children in both locations can grow up in a healthy and well-nourished environment. Fostered children can continue their education at home through remote classes, avoiding missing out on learning opportunities due to environmental factors. Caregivers in foster families have received educational training to nurture children through themes like care, appreciation, and acceptance, allowing them to grow in a positive environment. Families also engage in regular parent-child activities to increase children's participation at home and enhance their relationships with each other.





# Rehabilitation Path

China - Nanning & Dahua, Guangxi

## PROJECT NAME Guangxi Silver Lining Rehabilitation Center

Guangxi Silver Lining Rehabilitation Center divides children into 13 groups based on their abilities, each with corresponding courses and activities to ensure that children receive the most suitable rehabilitation and education within their respective age and ability ranges. In addition to face-to-face classes, the center also offers remote classes to benefit more children and families. As of 2023, the center has served 202 special children.

Adhering to the principle of "holistic development" and guided education, we are dedicated to providing comprehensive rehabilitation and education services for children with disabilities. The center's rehabilitation services cover not only life skills but also various aspects such as sports abilities, learning interests, language, character education, and employment skills through games or classes in different forms. For families with disabled children facing difficulties, the center organizes professional teams to visit these families for home training and guidance, provides financial support, and organizes various relaxation activities to help parents reduce life stress and focus on caring for their children. To help society better understand and accept children with disabilities, the center also arranges various outdoor activities for these children to enhance their adaptability, feel the warmth of society, and promote social inclusion.

## Myanmar - Yangon

### PROJECT NAME Yangon Silver Lining Rehabilitation Center

The Yangon Silver Lining Center for Disabled Children has been providing services to disabled children for over 20 years. Silver Lining has been in contact with the center since 2017 and introduced conductive education model. In 2023, the center continued to provide rehabilitation services for children to help them integrate into society, benefiting a total of 100 children.

The children's center offers various rehabilitation training programs to help children stretch their bodies, increase their learning interests, and some children have successfully enrolled in Burmese primary schools and integrated into society. The center's staff continually assess the children's rehabilitation and educational progress, revising rehabilitation goals based on their abilities to ensure that the children's capabilities are enhanced. Families of the children face various pressures while raising them, so the children's center also provides them with materials, guides them in making rehabilitation aids, and conducts remote training sessions to teach parents about rehabilitation.



## Vietnam - Hanoi

### PROJECT NAME Vietnam Silver Lining Rehabilitation Center

The Vietnam Silver Lining Rehabilitation Center in Hanoi primarily serves children with cerebral palsy and special needs, providing them with rehabilitation support through conductive education model, while also aiming to educate the public, fostering acceptance and understanding of disabled children. As of 2023, the center has served 23 children with cerebral palsy.

Through participation in rehabilitation classes designed by mentors and professionals, the children at the center can gradually exercise their muscles. The rehabilitation outcomes have been successfully showcased to the public as the children have participated in various sports competitions and games during outdoor activities, not only experiencing the joy of sports but also receiving societal support, encouraging both children and parents to integrate into society. During the year-end evaluations, the center's staff found that the children's progress in rehabilitation and education far exceeded expectations, indicating that the collaboration between families and schools has been immensely beneficial for the children's recovery. The center also focuses on parental stress, organizing group activities for parents to exchange caregiving experiences and support each other.



# Services for Children Living in Poverty

Myanmar - Pyin Oo Lwin

**PROJECT NAME** Student Care Center for Youth in Need

The Pyin Oo Lwin Grace Youth Shelter primarily serves underprivileged children from various regions in Myanmar, with current service count of 63 individuals. The center mainly provides a stable and secure living environment with meals, daily necessities as well as health and educational support. The center also hopes that the children can continue their education after graduation, preparing them to give back to society in the future.

We offer basic medical care and health check-ups to ensure their physical and mental well-being. The center provides education in both Burmese and Chinese languages to enhance their future employment opportunities. Through community engagement and a supportive framework of cooperation, we assist them in building strong interpersonal relationships and community awareness. Daily guidance promotes mental health, aiming for these young individuals to grow and thrive, encouraging them to break free from poverty using their own strengths.



Myanmar - Yangon

**PROJECT NAME** Yangon Youth Center ( PYCC )

The Yangon Youth Center (PYCC) began its preparations in 2019, and by mid-2023, students have been gradually enrolling. The center primarily serves diligent, impoverished students in the area, with a total of approximately 30 individuals. The center's director studied abroad and has some experience in student management. He is committed to supporting the assisted students in attending nearby Burmese schools until graduation, encouraging them to pursue higher education or acquire vocational skills, ultimately contributing back to society.

## Myanmar - HAKHA

### PROJECT NAME Services for Children Living in Poverty

We are dedicated to caring for children aged 11 to 13 in the Hakha region, with the aim of enhancing their well-being. These children are integrated into a loving family model environment. Our goal upon entering a new community is to assist them in social integration and increase their participation.

We provide them with appropriate nutrition to promote effective growth and offer additional supplementary courses to prepare them for a smooth transition to public schools in the future. Our services are based on a model rooted in compassion, encouraging children to grow and thrive, nurturing healthy and positive attitudes towards life.

## Myanmar - Nan Weng

### PROJECT NAME Nan Weng Silver Lining Puyi School

The Nan Weng Silver Lining Puyi School is a Chinese school funded by Silver Lining Missions, to provide high quality free education to children in need and encourage them to learn Chinese for enhancing their competitiveness. Currently, the school serves over 200 students. The project supports school infrastructure and facilities, including classrooms, student dormitories, sports fields, and student meals.

As many students come from remote areas to attend classes, the school, with funding from Silver Lining, has expanded student dormitories and provided living expenses for some students from financially disadvantaged backgrounds, ensuring they do not miss out on education due to poverty. Despite facing challenges in human resources, the school makes efforts to arrange four core subjects and remote classes for students. Additionally, the school emphasizes children's spiritual growth and character education, organizing various themed activities to enrich the children's inner development.

Silver Lining Missions provides assistance in the form of essential supplies to the affected children, aiming to alleviate the economic burden on families and ensure that the children's educational opportunities are not compromised.

# Emergency Medical Assistance

## Silver Lining Service Locations

### PROJECT NAME Emergency Medical Services

Dahua Silver Lining supports 7 children in need (with eye problems) with medical assistance, while Nanning Silver Lining supports 8 children in need with medical expenses (epilepsy), providing necessary financial aid to ensure they can receive appropriate treatment and care to improve their health and quality of life. During the period of assistance, social workers regularly follow up on the children's conditions, offer emotional and psychological support to parents, and accompany both children and parents in facing difficulties together, helping them through this challenging time.

Emergency Medical Case at Myanmar Silver Lining Family Village - Zheng Cui : Zheng Cui's spine is severely deformed due to spinal tuberculosis contracted in childhood. She now requires a second surgery. After examination in Singapore, it was found that the surgery it has posed significant difficulties and risks, making it impossible for the hospital to treat the child. Currently, an application is being made for the surgery to be performed in China. However, due to Myanmar's national policies, obtaining a visa has been challenging. Efforts are ongoing to address this issue.

# Vocational Training

## China - Nanning, Guangxi

### PROJECT NAME

#### Vocational Education for Disabled Youth

In terms of comprehensive vocational skills development, Silver Lining arranges vocational planning and skills training for youths based on their interests and abilities. Vocational counselors teach handicraft skills to disabled youths, such as making mosaic art, beaded jewelry, accessories, pen holders, and diamond paintings, to boost their confidence.

With the support of the Communist Youth League Jiangnan District Committee this year, disabled youths were given an opportunity to have a public welfare booth. Under the guidance and leadership of social workers, the youths learned practical skills such as setting up booths, organizing goods, and financial management. After six months of practice, three youths have developed the ability to independently set up booths outside.

### PROJECT NAME

#### Vocational Skill Support for Orphanage

In Myanmar, colleagues and teachers organize vocational planning groups for children, arranging one-on-one discussions to help children understand their career interests, training in life skills, and analyzing their academic abilities. To enhance the children's competitiveness in entering society, Silver Lining encourages them to learn both Chinese and Burmese languages. To ensure effective learning, mentors communicate regularly with the children and provide academic support.

PROJECT NAME Character Education for Diversity

Lifelong learning is a challenge that vulnerable children must face. Silver Lining understands that having a positive mindset helps children persevere in adversity. Guangxi Yuncai utilizes various character classes, story discussions, thematic activities, etc., to teach children to develop good character, cultivate a positive mindset, and establish a "Character of the Month" program to promote children's progress, mutual influence among peers, and grow together. Meanwhile, Dahua Silver Lining's social workers tailor the learning of correct values to children's physical and mental development in daily life. Yuncai mothers also participate in character education, extending education into the family.

## PROJECT NAME Chasing the Light : Dream Action Charity Concert for Disabled Children

In March, a charity concert for disabled children was held. With the support of Alibaba Philanthropy and various sectors of society, Silver Lining Missions disabled child Xiao Yan realized her dream of holding a concert. This event has not only fulfilled her dream but also conveyed a concept to society, that disabled individuals, including those with cerebral palsy, have the right to pursue beauty, even in the face of mobility challenges. This concert has inspired more people, allowing them to experience the vitality of life and the power of love.



## PROJECT NAME "Persisting for Love" Silver Lining 2023 Charity Dinner

The Guangxi Silver Lining Social Work Service Center organized the first "Persisting for Love" Silver Lining Charity Dinner in 2023. Gathered in love, disabled children, parents, and teachers shared stories of perseverance for love, walking alongside disabled children. "Love can change lives" is the most powerful expression of the sharing session. Silver Lining will continue to silently accompany and uphold the idea of changing lives with love. The event also showcased artworks and handicrafts created by disabled children, bringing deep emotions and positive energy to the viewers.





### PROJECT NAME Developing Professional Skills ( Youth Pre-Employment Training )

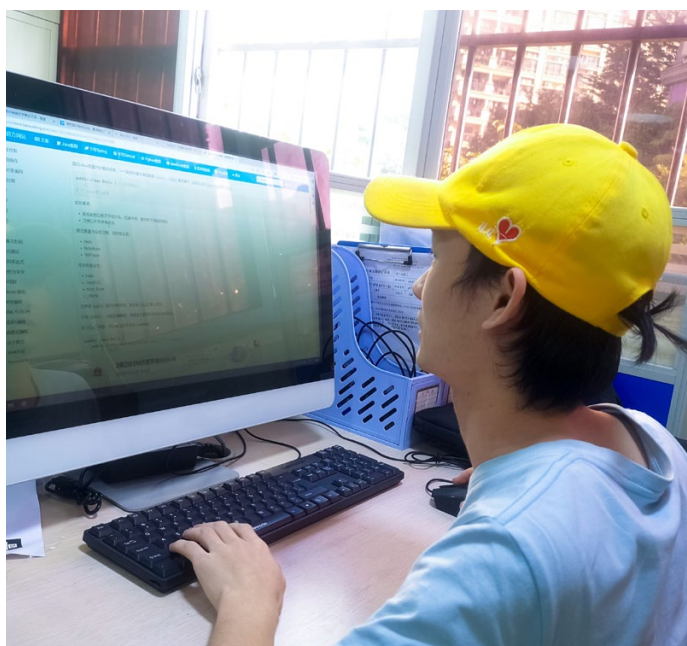
In May, Silver Lining organized the "Experience First, Accelerate Growth" vocational experience activity for youth. During the team-building session, the youth understood that good teamwork is a crucial factor for success in the workplace. Through interactive methods, they explored various professions, unveiling the mysteries behind different careers and sowing the seeds for their future dreams.

In November, Silver Lining's social workers organized the "Growing Together with the Future Camp" for youth. In the eyes of the youth, the future is filled with endless imagination and possibilities. By rational planning and practical efforts, their aspirations can become reality. The social workers guided the youth to contemplate their career directions and future paths, emphasizing the importance of understanding their own abilities to avoid blindly pursuing "trendy industries" and making realistic choices. Future planning requires sufficient effort and time. The focus of this activity was to provide the youth with relaxation and stress-relief opportunities, listen to their concerns, alleviate anxiety and pressure, and help them face academic and life challenges with a positive mindset.



### PROJECT NAME University Learning Program

This year, Guangxi Silver Lining had a total of 6 students who were able to enroll in universities. Currently, there are 19 children from Silver Lining studying at universities, with 5 set to graduate in 2024, bringing the total number of university graduates to 12. Among these 5 graduates, Lan Gui, Yu Hui, Jing Wei, Li Mei, and Qiu Feng are currently working at Silver Lining Missions.





# Silver Lining Key Activities Review

China - Hong Kong

PROJECT NAME "Silver Lining X Hands Up Second-Hand School Bag Fun Day 2023"

This year, Silver Lining Missions collaborated with hands up for a second-hand school bag recycling program. The results of the collection were announced on August 20th during the Second-Hand School Bag Fun Day, where various game booths were open to the public for participation and enjoyment. This event aimed to raise awareness about the needs of underprivileged children in rural areas, promote the concepts of thriftiness and environmental protection, and encourage resource sharing. The collected second-hand school bags from the event will be donated to children in need in impoverished regions.





## PROJECT NAME "Colors in the Clouds" Charity Walk 2023

This year, Silver Lining Missions once again partnered with Shanghai Commercial Bank to successfully conclude the "Colors in the Clouds" charity walk on November 12th. The funds raised from this event will be used to raise funds for the construction of Silver Lining Family Village in Vietnam and Indonesia, providing a home for orphans in Vietnam and Indonesia, expressing blessings to the children through actions. Myanmar - Pyin Oo Lwin

**PROJECT NAME** Dare2Dream Leadership Retreat

During the Dare2Dream leadership seminar, Silver Lining organized a multi-day event bringing together 112 children from three different projects for a seminar. The children were excited to gather with peers from different locations and expand their sense of community. Through participating in the seminar, they were able to learn practical ways to achieve their dreams and apply the lessons they have learned through various workshops. The children also had the opportunity to travel to Mandalay, visit malls, explore the local zoo, swim in nearby lakes, and explore the iconic U Bein Bridge.

**PROJECT NAME** "Hand in Hand, Journeying Together for a Lifetime" Couples Retreat

The Silver Lining in Vietnam organized a couples retreat for families with cerebral palsy, aimed at helping couples deepen their relationships and enhance the quality of their marriages. 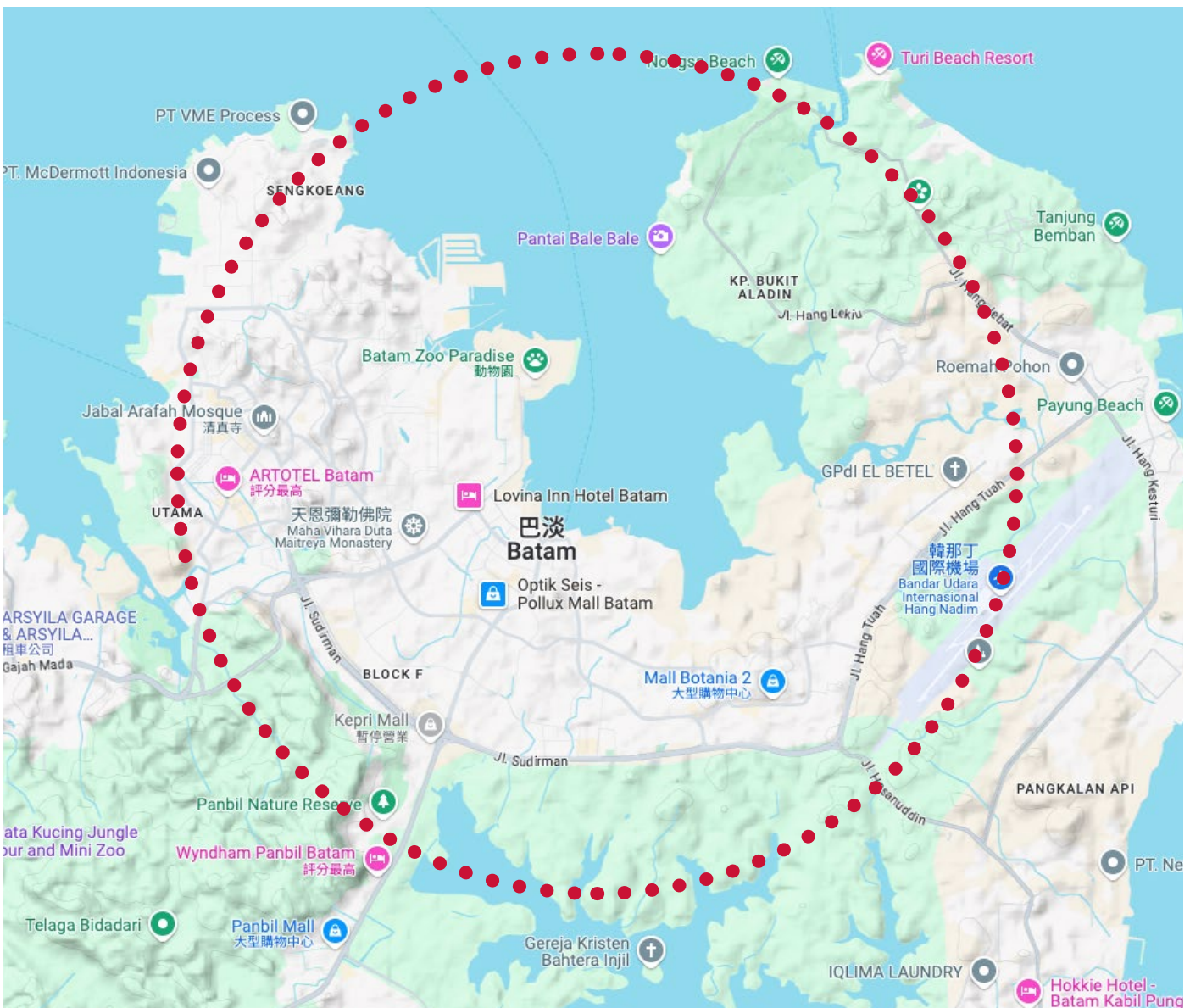


# 2024 New Development Projects

# 2023 Financial Report Summary



On behalf of Silver Lining Mission, I sincerely thank all donors for your support and trust over the past year. The global economic impact continued in 2023, with the ongoing civil war in Myanmar that has accompanied by inflation and rising prices everywhere. Despite these challenges, we are grateful for the ongoing support, which empowers us to respond promptly to needs. Thank you for walking this special and memorable journey with us, so that we can go further to serve the needy children and families.

In the fiscal year 2023, Silver Lining Mission received approximately US\$1.73million in donations. We are particularly thankful that regular donations has accounted for 35% of total income, corporate and institutional donations for 18%, and individual donations for 43%.

Actual expenditures for 2023 amounted to approximately US\$1.21 million. Despite the difficulties, we endeavored to meet the demands. Expenditures on orphan projects, children living in poverty and special need children projects have accounted for 33%, 43%and 19% respectively. Administrative and fundraising expenses amounted to only 1% and 3%. Hence, 96% of total expenditure directly benefitted orphan, children living in poverty and special children services. We have also seen the increasing need to buy land to build another family village and serve more children living in poverty in the near future.

We highly value your trust and promise to be good stewards, cherishing every resource entrusted to us. We work together to transform the lives of the orphans and special need children into the bright future and hope. 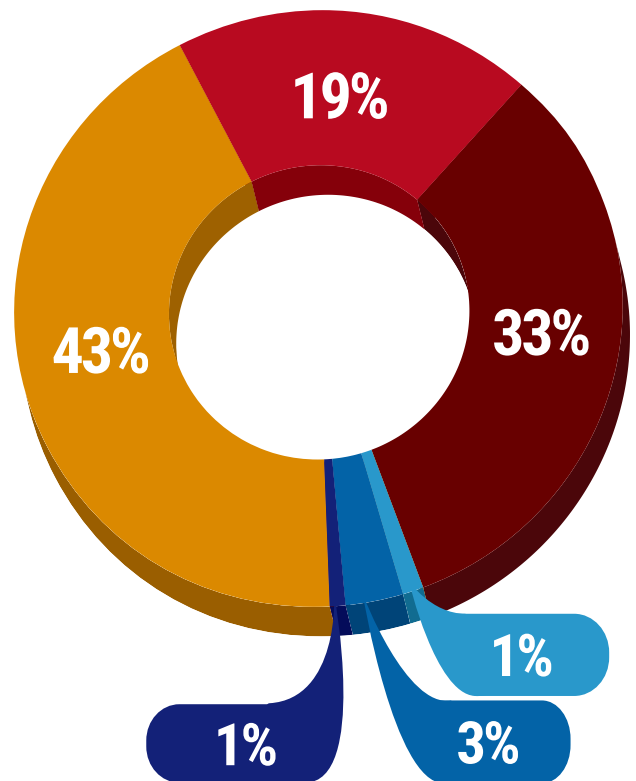
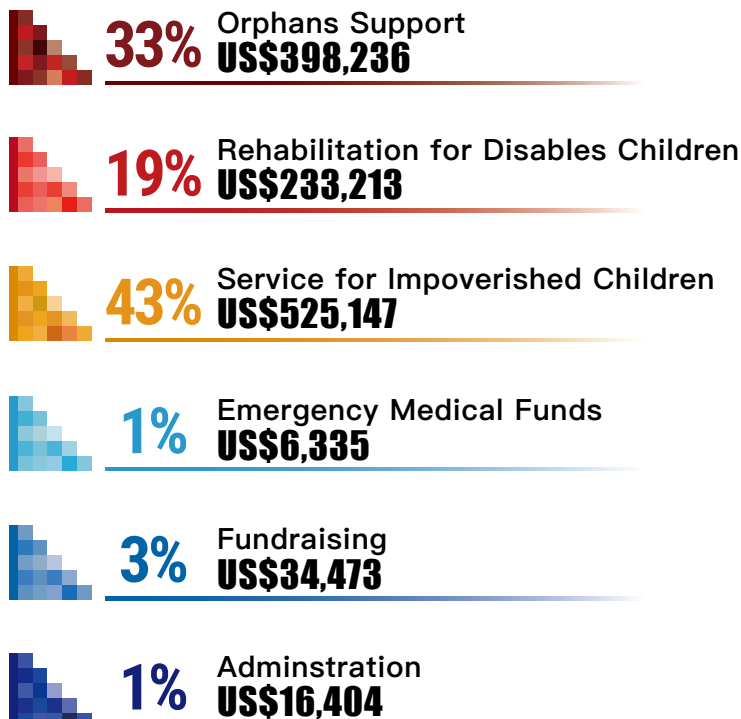


## 2023 Source of Donations
